RESOLUTION 2 - RE-ELECTION OF MR MICHAEL POLLAK AS DIRECTOR

The Company's Constitution requires that if the Company has 3 or more Directors, a third (or the number of Directors nearest to one third) of those Directors must retire at each annual general meeting, provided always that no Director (except a Managing Director) shall hold office for a period in excess of 3 years or until the third annual general meeting following his or her appointment, whichever is the longer, without submitting himself or herself for re-election. The Directors to retire at an annual general meeting are those who have been longest in office since their last election. Where 2 or more Directors have served equally the longest, the retiring Director is determined either amongst the Directors, or by drawing lots.

It has been agreed that Mr Pollak will retire by rotation at this Meeting. Mr Pollak was appointed as a Director of the Company following receipt of Shareholder approval on 23 January 2018.

A Director who retires by rotation under clause 46(b) of the Company's Constitution and Listing Rule 14.5 is eligible for re-election. Mr Pollak retired by rotation and seeks re-election at this AGM.

Background details for Mr Pollak are set out below.

Michael Pollak holds a bachelor of Commerce, is a chartered accountant and has an MBA in strategy from the Australian Graduate School of Management. Michael commenced his career in PricewaterhouseCoopers over 15 years ago. Michael has gained valuable experience in both Sydney and London in general management, audit, insolvency, corporate advisory and strategy across a wide range of industries, including financial services, professional services, retail, mining, technology and manufacturing.

Michael is currently a director of MOQ Limited and was previously a director of various ASX listed entities including UCW Limited, Prospect Resources Limited, Metalicity Limited, Rhipe Limited and Janison Education Group Limited, being companies that he previously recapitalised. Michael was also involved in the recapitalisation of various other companies listed on the ASX (via a DOCA and Creditors Trust).

Directors' recommendation

The Directors (excluding Mr Pollak) recommend that Shareholders vote for Resolution 2.

RESOLUTION 3 – REPEAL AND ADOPTION OF A CONSTITUTION

The Company's current constitution was adopted by the Company on 27 May 2010.

The Company intends to change its constitution (**New Constitution**) so that it is more appropriate for an ASX listed company as the constitution has not been updated for more than 8 years to reflect changes in the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules.

A complete signed copy of the New Constitution will be tabled at the Meeting.

This Resolution is a special resolution, and as such, it can only be passed if at least 75% of the total votes cast by Shareholders entitled to vote on this Resolution are voted in its favour.

Directors' recommendation

The Directors of the Company consider that it is in the best interests of the Company that it adopts the New Constitution. Accordingly, the Directors recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3.

Professional Advice

If you have any doubt or do not understand this Resolution, it is strongly recommended that you seek advice from a solicitor or other professional adviser.

RESOLUTION 4 - CHANGE OF COMPANY NAME

The Company proposes to change its name from "Antares Energy Limited" to "Big Star Energy Limited".

This change in name will not, in itself, affect the legal status of the Company or any of its assets or liabilities.

Pursuant to section 157 of the Corporations Act, a change in company name can only be enacted by Shareholders via a special resolution. Therefore, Resolution 4 can only be passed if at least 75% of the total votes cast by Shareholders entitled to vote on this Resolution are voted in its favour.

Directors' recommendation

The Directors of the Company recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 4.

RESOLUTION 5 - ASX LISTING RULE 7.1A APPROVAL OF FUTURE ISSUE OF SECURITIES

Under Listing Rule 7.1A, certain companies may seek Shareholder approval by special resolution passed at an annual general meeting to have the additional capacity to issue equity securities (which must be in the same class as an existing quoted class of equity securities of the Company) which do not exceed 10% of the existing ordinary share capital without further Shareholder approval. The ability of the Company to make an issue under Listing Rule 7.1A is in addition to its 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

Approval under this Resolution is sought for the Company to issue equity securities under Listing Rule 7.1A.

If this Resolution is approved the Company may make an issue of equity securities under Listing Rule 7.1A at any time (either on a single date or progressively) up until the earlier of:

- (a) the date which is 12 months after the date of the 2017 Annual General Meeting; or
- (b) the date on which Shareholders approve a transaction under Listing Rule 11.1.2 (a significant change to the nature or scale of activities) or 11.2 (disposal of main undertaking).

Accordingly, the approval given if this Resolution is passed will cease to be valid on the earlier of 31 May 2019 or the date on which holders of the Company's ordinary securities approve a transaction under Listing Rules 11.1.2 or 11.2.

At the date of this Explanatory Statement, the Company is an 'eligible entity', and therefore able to seek approval under Listing Rule 7.1A, as it is not included in the S&P/ASX300 and has a market capitalisation less than the amount prescribed by ASX (currently \$300 million). If at the time of the Annual General Meeting the Company is no longer an eligible entity this Resolution will be withdrawn.

The maximum number of equity securities which may be issued in the capital of the Company under the approval sought by this Resolution will be determined in accordance with the following formula prescribed in Listing Rule 7.1A.2:

$(A \times D) - E$

where:

- A is the number of shares on issue 12 months before the date of issue or agreement to issue:
 - (i) plus the number of fully paid shares issued in the 12 months under an exception in Listing Rule 7.2;
 - (ii) plus the number of partly paid shares that became fully paid in the 12 months;
 - (iii) plus the number of fully paid shares issued in the 12 months with approval of the holders of shares under Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.4 (this does not include an issue of fully paid ordinary shares under the entity's 15% placement capacity without Shareholder approval); and
 - (iv) less the number of fully paid shares cancelled in the 12 months.
- **D** is 10%.
- is the number of equity securities issued or agreed to be issued under Listing Rule 7.1A.2 in the 12 months before the date of the issue or agreement to issue that are not issued with the approval of Shareholders under Listing Rules 7.1 or 7.4.

The ability of the Company to make an issue under Listing Rule 7.1A is in addition to its 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1. The effect of Resolution will be to allow the Company to issue equity securities under Listing Rule 7.1A without using the Company's 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

As at 16 April 2018, the Company has on issue 166,000,017 ordinary shares and therefore has capacity to issue 24,900,002 equity securities under Listing Rule 7.1.
